Cost

Under 8 (Tackers) to Under 15	\$170
Youth Girls (ages 16-17)	\$195

Note - there are no ongoing costs for the remainder of the season, and the Sharks apply a \$10 discount for each extra child registered per family.

All new players to the Sharks receive a waterproof club jacket valued at over \$70

Age - YJFL By Law 6.2

To be eligible to play in the YJFL a child must turn 7 years of age between 1 January and 30 April in any given year; and be registering to play in an Under 8 competition (not Under 9).

New Rules applied in 2015

The YJFL adopted a modified version of the AFL advised rules for Under 8-10 football in 2015.

These rules include the removal of (U8-U9) or a modification to the tackling rule (U10). There are also changes to scoring etc which can be found on our website.

Park Orchards North Ringwood Parish Junior Football Club—The Sharks—was formed in 1991 as a result of a merger between Park Orchards and North Ringwood Parish Junior Football Clubs.

Park Orchards Junior Football Club had established a 22 year history, lead by President Mr J O'Brien in 1969, whilst the North Ringwood Parish Junior Football Club was established in 1984 and lead by President Father K Mogg.

Since forming the Sharks have won 27 premierships, including a league record 5 premierships in 2004, and a number of Sharks players have successfully transitioned into the AFL and enjoy accomplished careers.

AusKick is for all boys and girls from Prep through to Grade 6, running Saturday mornings 9am-10.45am.

What is the pathway for girls if they want to keep playing beyond youth girls?

Once you are over 18 and can no longer play Youth Girls, you can start playing senior womens football. There are many senior womens football teams throughout Victoria that play in the Victorians Womens Football League (VWFL). The AFL has also announced that their will be a National Womens Competition starting in 2017.

Are there other ways to be involved in girls footy if I don't want to play?

Absolutely. You can become a coach, an umpire, a trainer, a team manager or a club administrator. There are plenty of voluntary and paid roles in the AFL for females so contact the club to find out how you can get involved.
